William Langton of Illogan in the County of Cornwall Gent being in perfect mind and memory praises be to God for the same. Doe hereby make and ordaine this to be my last Will and Testament revoking and making void all former will and wills by me formerly made I doe make and ordaine this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and forme following I bequeath my Soule into the hands of my Redeemer and my body to receive Christian buriall I give and bequeath to the poore of the Parish of Illogan the summe of Twenty pounds of lawfull money of England to be paid immediately after my death and to be employed to build a house for such poore people as the Minister and the twelve men of the said parish shall thinke fitt to dwell in from time to time provided that if the house be built in my life time that then the said house be to be repared and be paid. I doe give and bequeath unto my Daughter Jane the wife of John Pemberthy sixtene pounds of lawfull money of England which said sixtene pounds is now due to me from her husband John Pemberthy. And I doe also give unto my Daughter Jane the summe of Twenty pounds of lawfull money of England to be paid within six months after my death. I doe give and bequeath unto William Pemberthy my grandson the summe of One hundred and fiftie pounds of lawfull money of England being the summe for which I have the moiety of the tithement of Pemberthy in Westgate in the parish of St. Mary together with the profits of the said tithement when her attains to the age of eightene yeares. I doe give unto my grandson John Pemberthy all my right title claim and demand which I have of in and unto the tithement called Kestell at Kestell in the said parish of St. Mary which is for fourteene and nineteene yeares next and immediately after the death of Edward Langton of the said parish of St. Mary. I doe give unto my granddaughter Gratt Pemberthy the summe of One hundred pounds of lawfull money of England and I doe give unto my grandson James Pemberthy the summe of One hundred pounds of lawfull money of England and I give and bequeath unto my grandson Joseph Pemberthy the summe of One hundred pounds of good and lawfull money of England. And I doe give and bequeath unto Pemberthy my grandson the summe of One hundred pounds of lawfull money of England the said respective summes to be managed and improved and employed for my said grandchildren best advantage by my Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereafter mentioned. And I doe make an Account of and satisfaction for the same and the improvement thereof unto my said grandchildren severally and respectively when they shall severally attain to the age of one and Twenty yeares or within six Months after the day of death of their Marriages. And my further will and intention is and I doe hereby declare the same to be that I doe hereby order advise will and bequeath that in case my said grandson William shall happen to die before hee come to the age of eightene yeares or be married or if either of the rest of my fornamed grandchildren shall dye before they attain to the age of one and Twenty yeares or be married that then one hundred pounds of such security of such Child or Children shall goe to the use and benefit of the next Child of the said John Pemberthy that shall happen to be borne and begotten on the body of Jane the now wife of the said John Pemberthy and the rest of the above.
