To poor of parish of Illogan, £20 to build a house for them as Minister & the 12 men of sd parish shall think fit. To my daur. Jane wife of John Penberthy £16 now due to me from her husband. Also to her £20. To William Penberthy my grandson £150 being the sum for which I have the moiety of the tenmt. of Penberthy in Mortgage in pish of St Illary & profits of sd moiety when he is 18 to my grandson John Penberthy my right I have to tenmt. called Kessell als Kistell in St Illary afsd which is for 99 years from the death of Honor Lampeare of St. Illary afsd to my granddaur Grace Penberthey £100. To my grandson Joseph Penberthey £100. To [blank] P. my grandson £100 -- to sd. grandchildren at 21 or marriage. If all die under 21, their legacies to my sd. daur. Jane Penberthey. To Joan Bloyes my daur £20. To my daur in law Jane Lanyon now wife of my sd son John Lanyon £20. yearly for life out of tenmt of Penhillicke after death of her husband, or if she do not receive it, then £250 being the consideration in the deed whereby I claim the sd tenmt of Penhillicke assigned me by my sd son John Lanyon by way of mortgage. On redemption sd. daur in law to have the £250. £100 to first born child to be born by my daur Joan Bloyes, at 21 or marriage, meanwhile interest thereof to my sd daur. £20 for my funeral. To John Lanyon of St Ives my kinsman £5 in a piece of plate. If my granddaur Grace Cock have another child in my lifetime, £100 to same at 21. To my son in law John Penberthey £5 in plate. Rest of lands and goods to my son John Lanyon & he to be executor. Testator made his mark. Witns Richard Brown, John Jenkyn, Michael Michell.
